Principles of Haematology Oncology

Key Benefits

Students attending this course unit will develop the knowledge and skills to care for patients undergoing treatment for a haematological malignancy. The unit can be taken as a single course unit for Continuing Professional Development (CPD) or as part of the Degree Programme. Clinical practice is undertaken in the student's own area of practice.

What will I learn?

This course aims to:

- Develop student's understanding of the pathophysiology of haematological malignancies and the aetiological factors, which may contribute to the development of haematological conditions/ diseases within local, national and international populations.
- Facilitate students to examine current practice and service delivery to people with haematological disease and using current evidence and policy, identify areas for improvement/ enhancement within the multi-professional/multiagency team.
- Examine the complex needs of haematology oncology patients within the context of changing healthcare provision and the use of evidence based practice
- Evaluate current national and local policy, Government and clinical guidelines, protocols for care delivery, evidenced based practice and analyse their influence in the identification, treatment and management of haematological malignancy and the delivery of care.

Pre-requisites

Level 6

Must have successfully studied at Level 5. Must be registered with the NMC – if NMC registration is not appropriate, applicants must have achieved GCSE English at Grade C or above or equivalent.

Level 7

In addition to a recognised health professional qualification*, all applicants require one of the following:

A relevant honours first degree (2:2 or above, or equivalent) from an approved higher education institution
Evidence of previous advanced study, research or professional experience which the University accepts as qualifying the applicant for entry

* Health Professional refers to registered Nurses, Midwives or Allied Health

Professionals (AHPs) in direct clinical contact with patients and registered as such with the UK NMC, HCPC or their equivalent in other countries
